



Tifereth Israel President and Clergy share A Thought Before Shabbat - Friday, March 20, 2020

Dear Family and Friends of Congregation Tifereth Israel,

If there was ever a need for Shabbat M'nucha, for Shabbat rest, this Shabbat is it. Between the mental energy we've all exerted in taking almost all aspects of our lives online, the emotional toll that comes along with not being able to interact with each other as we have done for all our lives, and the physical strain many of us have expended on childcare and homeschooling, a day of rest is just what the doctor ordered. It is a moment to take a pause from the stress of this new reality and, just as we do each week, sanctify this holy time. We will be doing it differently this week than we ever have before, but the k'dusha (holiness) of the moment will not be diminished.

Of course we know what is waiting on the other side, another week of social distancing and isolation as we all do our part to flatten the curve. Even so, with each passing day will come higher numbers of those infected and new projections of how long this will last. The economic impact of the pandemic has already been dramatic and harsh, and threatens to grow worse. We wish we could say with certainty that the week ahead will be better than the week that is coming to close...if only wishing made it so.

Through it all, we have been inspired by the number of congregants who have reached out and asked what it is that we all can do to help. It inspires us and serves as a reminder that we are a community that always supports one another, especially in an et tzarah (time of trouble) like this one. So with this "Thought Before Shabbat" we would like to share a few thoughts on how we can all continue to support one another in the coming weeks:
